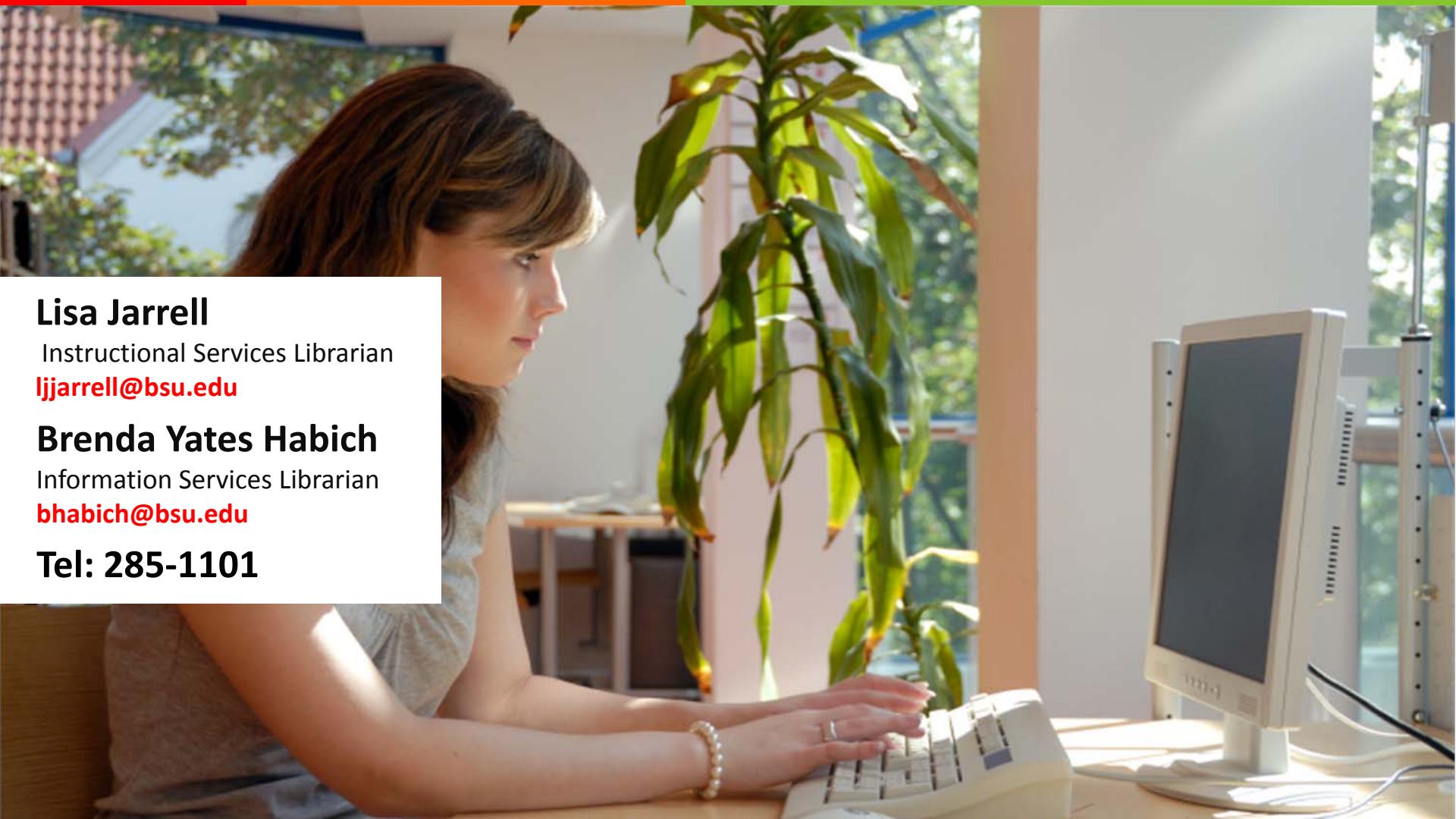

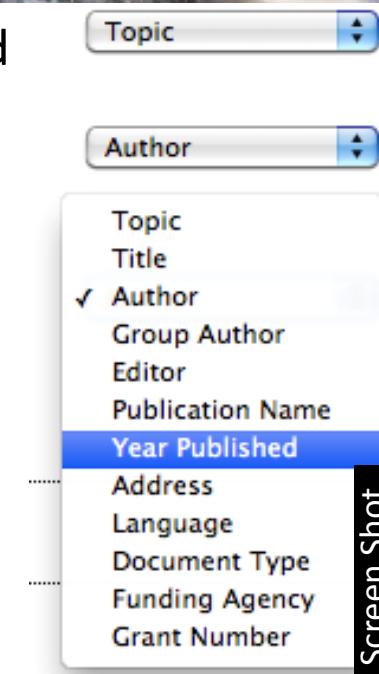

SEARCH FIELDS



- **Author** = every available author originally listed on the paper, last name & 1 or more initials
- **Group Author** = credited with authorship
- **Publication Name** = journal title where originally published
- **Publication Year** = single or span (must be 10 years or less)
- **Address** = all author affiliations published in the original work



WHAT DOES = SEARCH?



- **Must select Web of Science Database**
- **Can search by:** Author (Use variations of the name), Journal (source), Cited year
- Don't need all 3
- **NOTE:** Doing a basic author search does not necessarily give the same results as a cited reference search of the same author.

Cited Reference Search. Find the articles that cite a person's work

Step 1: Enter the author's name, the work's source, and/or publication year.

Cited Author: 

Example: O'Brian C* OR OBrian C*

Cited Work: 

Example: J Comput Appl Math*
journal abbreviation list

Cited Year(s): 

Example: 1943 or 1943-1945

CITED REFERENCE SEARCH



- **Journal Use Reports (BSU does NOT have access)**
- Being acknowledged by Thomson Scientific as a Highly Cited Researcher means that an individual is among the 250 most cited researchers for their published articles within a specific time-period. Citation is a direct measure of influence on the literature of a subject, and it is also a strong indicator of scientific contribution, since it is derived from pattern of interaction among millions of published articles.
